SECURITY MEASURES

I. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

The meeting began at 7:10 PM with opening remarks from **WHNA President Bob Jones**. Bob extended a welcome to the Wilshire Heights neighbors in attendance, as well as guests from the Dallas Police Department and the guest speaker for the evening, Nancy Nance, from the Dallas Arboretum. Bob introduced all of the Board members, and he thanked them for their efforts on behalf of the neighborhood.

II. TREASURY REPORT

Bob summarized the mid-year Treasury Report. There is currently a balance of \$5,052.78. Since the beginning of the fiscal year (October 1, 2013), total revenue of \$3,048.00 has been received from member dues and donations.

Expenses for the period totaled \$1,989.41, primarily for the newsletter, event costs, VIP expenses and block parties. There are currently 100 active members.

III. CRIME WATCH

Board member Sheila Bower told the membership that she produces the weekly crime watch emails. Most of the major crimes in the neighborhood are burglaries of motor vehicles (BMVs). She provided suggestions on preventing these types of incidents. Sheila reminded all to check their alleys,

which can be hiding places for criminals. She asked for suggestions or concerns to be sent to her. Sheila then introduced our neighborhood **Dallas Police Department (DPD) officers, Daniel Camacho and Michael Lee**. Officer Camacho commented that BMVs are occurring because of items left in cars; everything should be removed, even small things. Criminals will return if they see opportunities. With summer coming up and kids out of school, extra vigilance is needed. He asked that neighbors call 911 when anything suspicious is seen. This provides officers with the right to stop suspicious individuals and ask for ID. Officer Lee talked about upcoming events, such as the prescription drug drop-off program, the May 3rd K-9 unit event and provided flyers for distribution. Board Member Denise McRoberts talked about the possibility of holding a home tour in Wilshire Heights in the spring of 2015. She has surveys for feedback on this project, or neighbors can email her directly at denise.mcroberts@gmail.com.

V. WILSHIRE HEIGHTS DINING OUT

Board member Kelsey Birdsall invited neighbors to attend the next dining event at The Truck Yard on lower Greenville, scheduled for April 29. The previous month's event at Hoffman Hots in Trinity Groves was well attended. VI. GUEST SPEAKER

Nancy Nance from the Dallas Arboretum gave a short presentation to the membership. The Arboretum is known for its year-round programming, its education programs and the research conducted on site. Growers from across the country send samples to be tested. Annuals are on trial for one year, perennials for three. Tests are conducted in extreme weather, which can vary by as much as 100 degrees. This past year has been very challenging for the Arboretum with extreme weather conditions.

Nancy recommended using compost and expanding shale (can be purchased at Living Earth) to help with our clay soil. She discussed the effectiveness of mulch for keeping out weeds and retaining moisture; pecan shell mulch is used at the Arboretum, which is turned into the soil in the fall. Arboretum events include the annual Dallas Blooms, Artscape, the summer concert series, adult education classes and the new Rory Myers Children's Garden. A new 3-story parking will open in the fall, eliminating the need for buses. Nancy presented samples of Arboretum plants and talked about their best growers, including the "Flameproof awards survivors," dragon wing begonias, lantana, basil pesto perpetuo, cannas, blackfoot daisy perennial, phlox, ferns, herbs, coleus and wild ginger. She took questions from neighbors on soil testing, planting and mulching.

VII. CITY COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE

District 14 City Councilman Philip Kingston greeted the membership and explained that he is attending meetings throughout the district. Questions have been raised on connecting the trail system, expanding library hours and increasing rec center options. He pointed out that there is a \$900 million shortfall in the maintenance portion of the City budget. He is asking for street repairs to be prioritized based on use. Philip also asked for volunteers for the bike task force that is being formed.

Philip encouraged neighbors to contact him directly with pressing issues and questions. He complimented Wilshire Heights on the degree of neighbor involvement and participation.

VIII. VOLUNTEERS IN PATROL (VIP)

Mark Moynahan talked about the success of the WHNA VIP program and asked for additional volunteers to participate. He remarked that it is a great way to get to know your neighbors and be involved. VIP training is provided by the Dallas Police Department.

Board members Judy and Peter Czarny coordinated a drawing for a wine tasting for ten that was donated by Times Ten Cellars. The drawing was won by Ellsworth neighbor Tim Temperley. A second gift, a complimentary admission to Artscape at the Arboretum was won by Martel neighbor Denise McRoberts.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:25. Neighbors stayed after the meeting to enjoy pizza from Scalini's and wines from Times Ten Cellars.

West Nile Virus Early Alert!

Just in case you were thinking the freezing winter weather we experienced killed all the mosquitoes, think again.

Dallas County Health and Human Services says the cold weather does not kill many mosquitoes so the 2014 virus awareness campaign is starting earlier than ever. Health officials are anticipating more human cases of West Nile virus due in part to changes in the rules for diagnosing and reporting the disease. With more cases of the disease anticipated, officials will direct the amount of ground spraying and potentially trigger earlier and controversial calls for aerial spraying. DCHHS Dr. Zachary Thompson emphasizes early public awareness and education to reduce the abundance of mosquitoes which will in turn reduce the number of West Nile cases. He urges the public to be ready by mosquito-proofing themselves and their homes by following the "4D's":

- Drain standing water
- Dress in long, loose, and light colored-clothing.
- Stay indoors at Dusk and Dawn when mosquitoes are most active
- Use insect repellants that contain DEET. 🦟

DALLAS WATER CONSERVATION ORDINANCE

Remember the city ordinance guidelines:

- 1) Maximum twice-weekly watering allowed according to address (see chart below).
- 2) Water yard before 10am or after 6pm.

Do

- Hand water or use a soaker hose any time.
- Maintain your sprinkler system. Repair any broken, missing or misdirected sprinkler heads.
- Remember that all automatic sprinkler system owners are required to have rain and freeze sensors installed.
- Remember to monitor your total water usage. If you use more than 15,000 gallons a month, you pay a surcharge on the amount above 15,000.

Don't:

- Water during any form of precipitation.
- Allow your sprinkler system to water driveways, sidewalks and streets.
- Waste water by allowing runoff onto a street or other drainage area when you're watering.
- Water your yard between 10 am and 6 pm from April 1 to October 31.

Fines for violations: \$250-\$,2000 per incident. First offenses will issued a warning.

Water saving tip:

If you give your lawn one inch of water every 5-7 days, the water will sink in and encourage the roots to grow stronger. Deep and infrequent watering is key to keeping your lawn healthy and your water costs under control all summer long.

Place a few empty tuna cans in your yard in the pattern of your sprinkler's spray. As you water, avoid runoff by pausing to allow water to absorb as needed. Once the tuna cans are full, your lawn has had enough water. You can use this handy tip to determine how to set your automatic sprinkler or to time your manual sprinklers.
