Please be sure to visit websites or call before heading out for any of these activities!

- Shakespeare Dallas presents an entire month of Outdoor Movies in the Park! Join us every Thursday, Friday and Saturday October 1-24, 2020 for socially-distanced evenings at Samuell-Grand Amphitheatre. Thursdays are Shakespeare inspired movies, Fridays enjoy a classic selection, and on Saturdays watch a family friendly film. Food trucks will be available on site and guests can pack their own picnics. Advance purchase required.

- October 13 –30: Early voting; the closest locations are Samuell Grand Recreation Center, Oak Lawn Library, Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, and George Allen Court Building
- You can vote by mail if you are sick or disabled, over 65, or will be out of the county for early voting and election day. Submit an application by mail before October 23. Visit dallascountyvotes.org



### Is Halloween Cancelled??

It goes without saying that 2020 has been a year unlike any other in recent memory, with the COVID-19 pandemic affecting everything from concerts to weddings, backyard barbecues to sport, and, maybe most notably, the way we interact with each other. So, with a little over a month to go until gangs of ghouls, goblins and ghosts are ringing doorbells across the neighborhood hoping to receive their favorite sweet treat, there are likely many neighbors, both young and old, wondering how the coronavirus will impact Halloween.

The Centers for Disease Control recently noted that the main risk at Halloween is not that the candy may be contaminated – scientists have found that surface bacteria is not the main mode of transmission for COVID.



The most significant risk hinges on who you are actually trick-or-treating with, because close contact is defined as those who are with 6 feet of you for more than 10-15 minutes.

In the end each family will have to look at the prevalence of COVID-19 cases in Dallas on October 31 and make their own decisions. And as always, you should consult with your physician or pediatrician before making a decision. But if you do decide to head out here are some tips to follow to ensure a safe and fun time for all. As always the most important thing is to look out for each other and make sure that you are following local public health guidance.

#### Tips for the Trick or Treaters

- Children with chronic conditions or at high risk for illness should not trick-or-treat.
- Safety practices such as social distancing and masks are still in place.
- Go out only with a small group (3-4 at the most) that you trust have been following best practices.
- Stay far away from other groups that are out.
- Limit the number of houses you visit this year and don't linger at any one house.
- Bring hand sanitizer and use it. It's not necessary after every house but should be used frequently.
- Put the candy away for a few days to allow any virus to die off naturally.

#### Tips for Those Handing out Candy

- Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth when giving out candy.
- Turn on the porch light or have a lighted pumpkin out to indicate you will be handing out treats.
- Keep face-to-face interactions short.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer frequently.
- If you want to avoid face-to-face interactions, consider creating small goodie bags of treats for a grab-and-go bowl that you can set out on your porch. If you are worried about children taking to many, put out only a few at a time and replenish in between visitors.
- Set up a table on the driveway and hand out treats as a way of enforcing social distancing.

You are not a "Halloween Grinch" if you decide not to hand out treats this year. Everyone has to make the best decision they can for their own health and the health of their family. Let's continue to look out for each other – it's the Wilshire Heights way!

## Drive Up then Park, Pop, and Pay!

PARK: Stay in your vehicle - a masked volunteer will assist you. We appreciate your wearing a

mask!

**POP**: Pop your trunk or unlock the doors for volunteer to remove the boxes/bags to be shredded.

**PAY**: A volunteer will tell you the total – give **CASH** or check payable to "**FOTP**" to volunteer

While you are getting those documents taken care of please consider joining the Friends of Tietze Park. FOTP was formed in 2002 when a group of concerned citizens got together to create the foundation. The foundation is dedicated to the improvement, preservation, and continued beautification of Tietze Park. Since its formation, the FOTP has overseen the restoration of the WPA era pavilion, new lighting throughout the park, landscaping, the perimeter walkway, exercise stations, a shade structure on the playground, and of course the wonderful pool renovation.

#### Fall Garden Checklist

Fall is an ideal time to garden in north Texas. The weather is cool and there are many flowers, shrubs, and vegetables that are perfect for the fall garden.

#### October

- October is the perfect time to plant wildflower seeds such as bluebonnets, coreopsis, poppies, Indian blanket, and Indian paintbrush.
- Plant daffodils from late October to mid November.
- Plant pansies, flowering kale and cabbage, dianthus, cyclamen, violas for fall color as the weather cools at the end of the month
- Late October is an excellent time for planting shrubs and hardy perennials
- Plant cilantro, garlic, leaf lettuce, parsley, radishes, spinach, and turnips.
- Prune dead wood from trees and shrubs, but wait until the dormant season for major re-shaping. Tidy the garden by removing spent summer annuals, pruning dead bloom spikes off warm season perennials, and re-shaping overgrown perennials later in the season.

#### **November**

### The average date for the first frost is November 21

- Divide and replant perennials such as Iris and daylily.
- Mulch leaves on your lawn. Shred excess leaves and add to planting beds or compost pile.
- Relocate established trees and shrubs after they enter dormancy (late November to January). Plant 'balled and burlap' trees and large shrubs.
- Remove and drain garden hoses from outlets and cover faucets to prevent freeze damage.
- Its time to cover your foundation vents to keep pipes from freezing

#### **December**

- Continue to mulch leaves from the lawn. Shred excess leaves and add to planting beds or compost pile. Replenish finished compost and mulch in planting beds, preferably before the first freeze.
- Water thoroughly before a hard freeze to reduce plants' changes of damage.

#### December, cont.

- Water lawn and all other plants once every three weeks or so, if supplemental rainfall is less than one inch in a three week period.
- Fertilize pansies and other winter annuals as needed.
- Protect tender plants from hard freezes. Switch sprinkler systems to 'Manual' mode for the balance of winter.
- Be sure to clean, sharpen and repair all your garden and lawn tools. Now is also the best time to clean and have your power mower, edger and trimmer serviced.
- Provide food and water to the area's wintering birds.

#### **Neighbors VIP Keep Crime Rate Low**

Wilshire Heights neighbors know that our neighborhood enjoys a relatively low crime rate. Much of that is due to the weekly Crime Watch emails that keep us informed and remind us of the active steps we can take to reduce our risk. But another part of our Crime Prevention program comes from our Volunteers In Patrol (VIP), neighbors who patrol in pairs and provide the police with extra eyes and ears in the neighborhood.

Currently we have about 20 patrollers who have gone through training and are out on foot about 2 hours each month.


