Wilshire Heights neighbors gathered at Stoney's Wine Bar in May for a chance to mingle and hear from our civic officials.

Dallas Police Officer Zacharias discussed "I Watch Dallas" - a new app where you can report suspicious activity, upload a video, and submit tips to the police. Overall crime remains low in Wilshire Heights with vehicle thefts continuing to be the most common problem. So don't forget to lock your cars, park in the garage if possible, and remove all valuables from your car every day.

District 14 Park Board member Rudy Karimi gave us an update on the Sand Volley Ball Court planned for Tietze Park. The funding is in place thanks to fund raising efforts by the Friends of Tietze Park and a matching grant from the city. The next step is to gather community input on the court and then construction can begin. Rudy is hoping that funding for a new playground that is 100% barrier free for kids of all abilities will be included in the 2024 bond package. He would also like to see path and light improvements.

Triangle Sign Proposal

Your WHNA Board has proposed a new sign for the traffic triangle at McCommas and Clements. After much discussion a design was agreed upon, and it will look very much like the sign toppers on street signs throughout the neighborhood. The new monument sign will sit astride the large boulder in the triangle and will be about 48 inches by 19 inches, sitting four feet above ground level. We have met with the City of Dallas and are nearly ready with all the requirements to submit our proposal for a license and a permit. We have two bids for the manufacture and installation of the new sign. After a 24 hour delay due to spring storms, close to 150 friends gathered at Karen and Joe Motes backyard to start the evening out with appetizers and a selection of fine wines from Wine Therapist. We then strolled up to Scott and Amie Blaszczyk's home on McCommas for a selection of baguette sandwiches and skewers, and ended the evening with Prosecco and desserts in Tricia McMahon's front yard on Malcolm. Flamenco guitarist Tomas Sclar provided the musical entertainment once again this year. Many thanks to our yard hosts, community organizers, and wine pourers. And a special thanks to Marc Freundlich for assisting with the wine glasses, to Phil Nikpour for his advice on wines and help with pouring, and to David Holder for providing seating for the event.



Meet Phil Nikpour - Our Neighborhood Wine Therapist

It would be hard to identify the number one reason that Wilshire Heights is a great neighborhood, but certainly high on the list would be the fact that we have our very own wine therapist Phil Nikpour.



Phil grew up in the Hillcrest Historic District of Little Rock, Arkansas. He was first introduced to the idea of fine wines when his family made trips to Napa Valley as well as to the Arkansas wine country. Phil began collecting wines after he moved to Dallas in 1989 to attend SMU. While he was studying abroad in the fall of 1991, he noticed that Europeans always drank good wine with their meals. Phil moved to Wilshire Heights in 2003 and opened The Wine Therapist in 2004. The shop was originally located on Live Oak Avenue and later moved to its current location at 1909 Skillman Avenue.

When asked what advice he would give to someone new to wines he offered "Taste, Taste & Taste! Be open to a wine adventure where you may end up liking a Chardonnay from Chablis where you didn't like that buttery Cali Chard, or a Merlot from Saint Emilion when you stopped drinking Merlot because of Sideways the movie." Among his favorite wines he lists Cote du Rhones, red and white Burgundies, Bordeaux, Malbec from Cahors, and Texas whites made from Roussanne grapes. His ideal wine tasting group would include Maharajah of St Estephe (a.k.a Louis Gaspard D'Estournel from Bordeaux), Francis Mallman, a chef from Argentina, Ottmar Liebert for guitar, and Jesus for when he runs out of wine.

So, whether you are a wine novice looking to learn a little more about good wines or just want to sip wine and listen to live music - be sure to stop by and enjoy some wonderful wine therapy! Salut!

Tasting Notes from the 2023 Wilshire Heights Wine Walk

Napa Cellars Sauvignon Blanc, Napa Valley, 2021 \$16.99

Opens with alluring aromas of tropical fruit, gooseberry, and lemongrass. A full and lively palate of guava, peach, and grapefruit complemented by bright acidity gives way to a lingering, crisp finish.

Mont Gravet Rose, South of France 2021 \$11.99

Mont Gravet Rosé has a light pale pink color and delicious aromas of strawberries and raspberries. It is wonderfully fresh and harmonious on the palate with long lasting fruit flavors.

Mont Gravet GSM, South of France, 2020 \$11.99

34% Granache, 33% Syrah, 33% Mourvèdre

The Grenache provides expressive berry flavors with a juicy and smooth palate. Syrah brings a good structure to the blend, with voluptuous aromas of sweet spices. The Mourvèdre gives to the final wine its firm tannins and deep color.

Angeline Pinot Noir, Mendocino, Cali, 2021 \$15.99

Notes of blackberry, cherry tart, dried currants, and touches of mace. Weighted with rich fruit and bramble, with a trace of dried Aleppo pepper, which carries over silky tannins and wet stone.

Be Human Cabernet Sauvignon, Washington St, 2018 \$16.99

Aromas of black currant, spice and dark fruit. Rich through the middle with plenty of structure to back it up.

Cabert Prosecco, Italy \$13.99

The bouquet is fruity with hints of flowers. Crisp, medium-bodied, harmonious with a delicious aromatic after-taste. Lovely Bubbles!



7 Tips for Protecting Your Garden from the Texas Heat

There is no doubt about it – it gets hot in Texas! Below are tips from The Dallas Garden School on how to best your garden from the triple digits.

- 1. Increase watering frequency the general rule for watering a garden under normal circumstances is to give plants one inch of water per week. But once temperatures reach 100 degrees, however, certain plants such as vegetables, bedding annuals, and plants in containers will require daily watering.
- 2. Water deeply in the morning this is a practice that you should always adopt no matter how hot it is outside, but it's especially important when the temperature rises above 100. In Dallas watering is allowed only from 6 pm to 10 am.
- **3. Consider shade cloth** for plants that are sensitive to heat or seem to be wilting faster than other plants, shade cloth lets only a certain percentage of sunlight through to the plants below and can reduce temperatures by as much as 15 degrees. Look for a 40% to 50% shade cloth.
- 4. Reduce fertilizer fertilizer can place unnecessary stress on plants when temperatures are very high. Under stressful conditions, plants need to allocate as many resources as possible towards survival rather than producing new growth. Resume your normal fertilization schedule once temperatures fall back into the 90s.
- **5.** Add another layer of mulch mulch is a multitasking superhero in the garden. Mulch conserves and cools the soil, prevents disease, suppresses weeds, and adds nutrient-rich humus to the soil as it breaks down. Apply a hardwood mulch to a depth of a least three inches
- **6. Move containers to shadier** locations the ideal location for containers in hot weather is a location that receives morning sun and afternoon shade. Containers will also benefit from a layer of mulch.
- 7. Check for plants that are still wilted after sundown some plants will naturally wilt a bit in the middle of the day but perk up after sundown. Once the sun goes down, check for plants that are still wilted and give them a good long soak.
